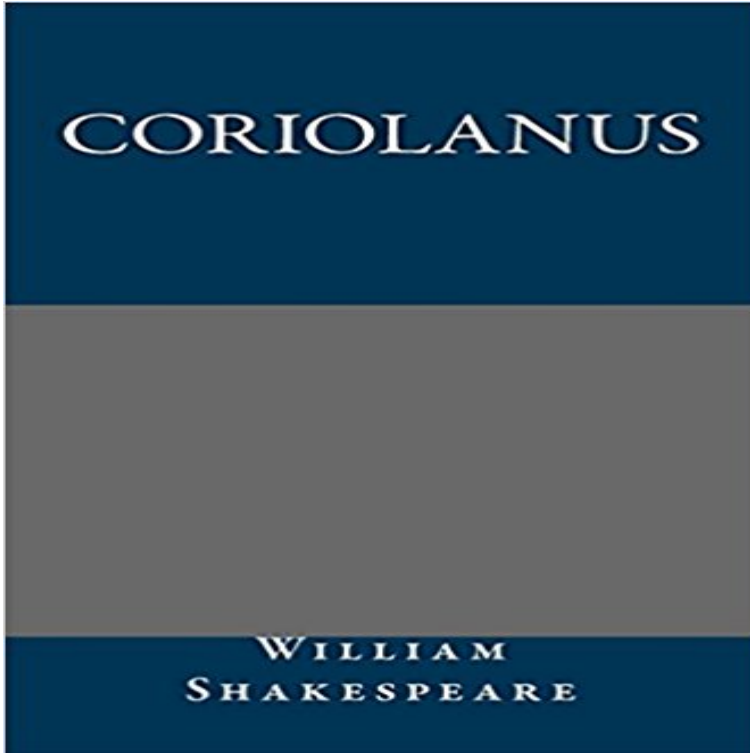


Coriolanus
