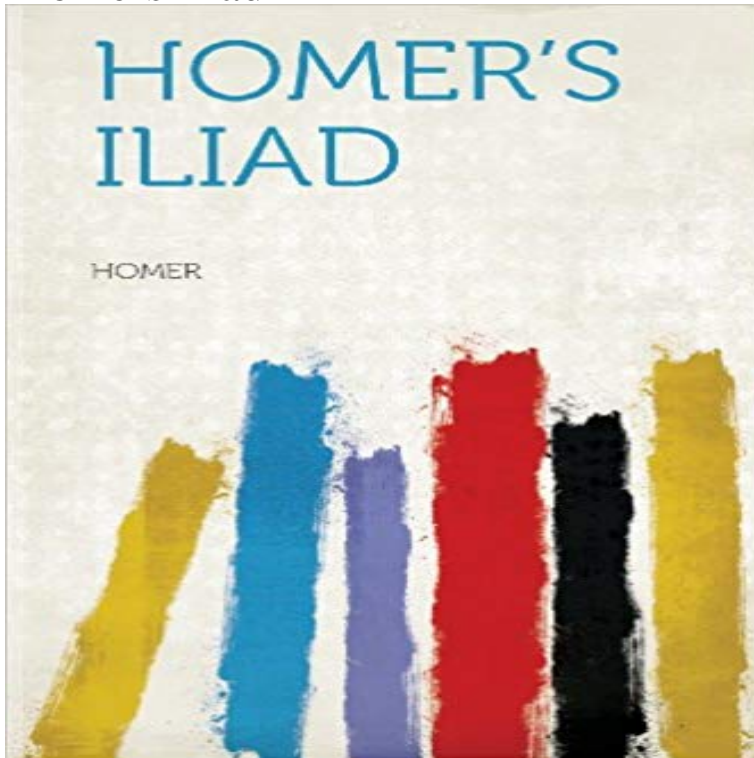


Homers Iliad
