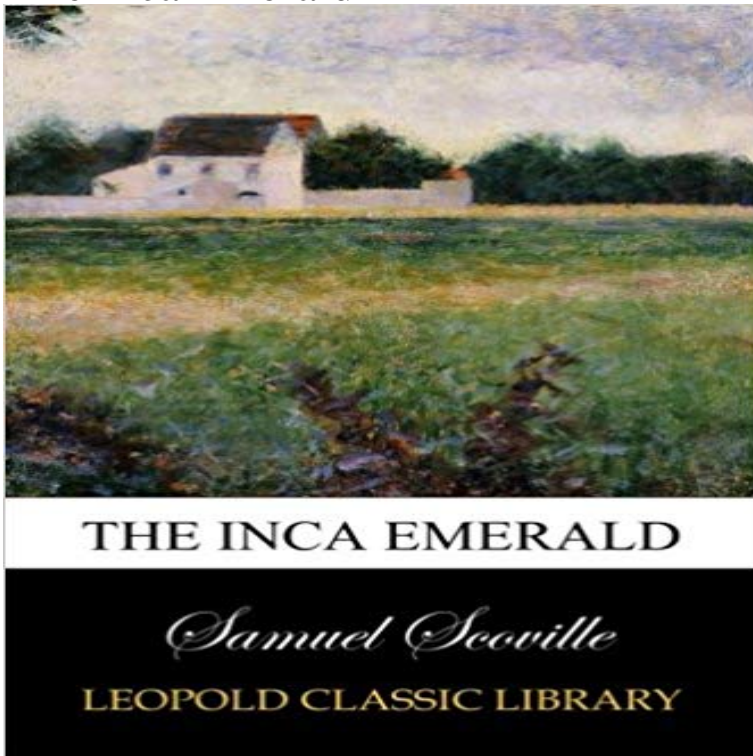


## The Inca Emerald
