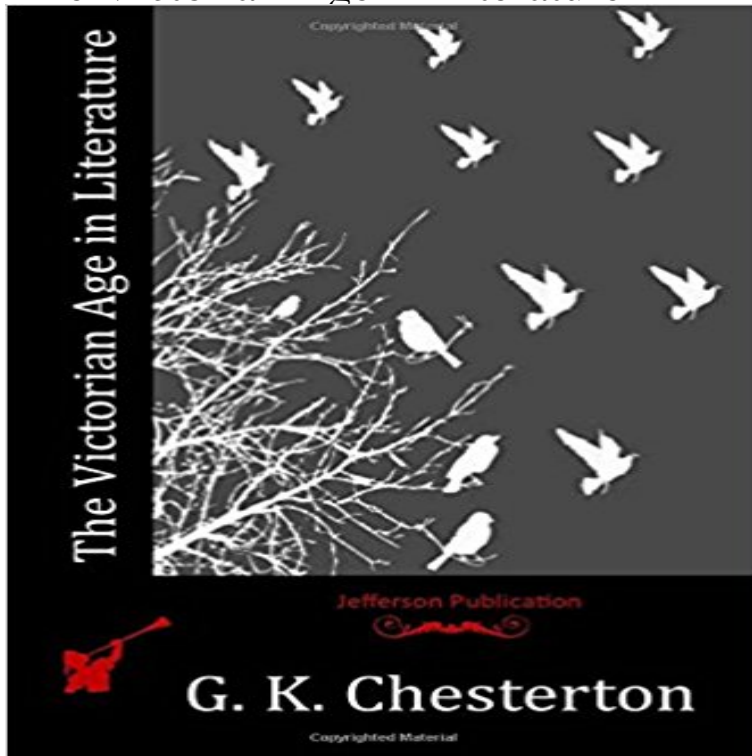


The Victorian Age in Literature
