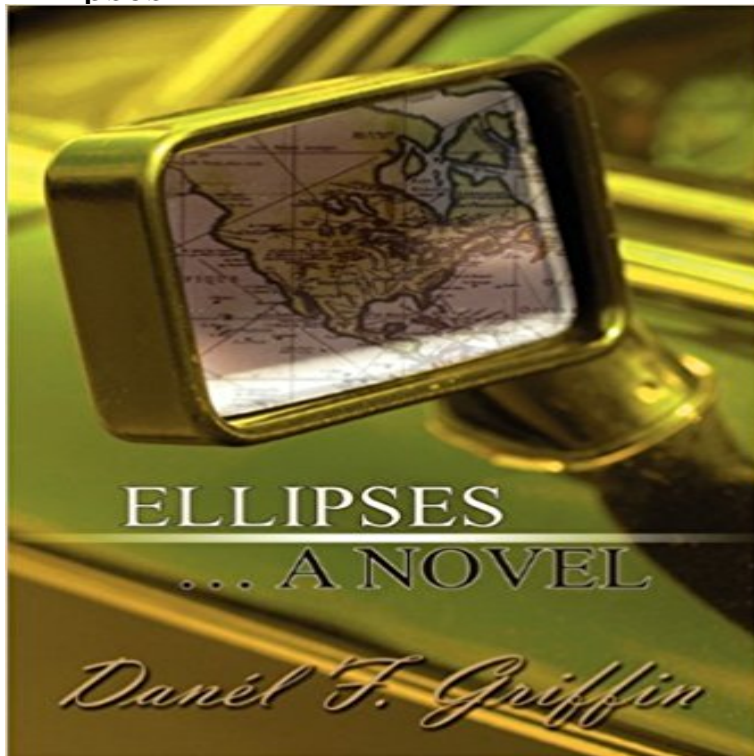


# Ellipses
